

National Hurricane Center (NHC) Update

According to the National Hurricane Center (NHC) in Miami, Florida, as of 5:00 PM (AST) on August 31, 2019, the eye of Hurricane Dorian was located near latitude 26.2 North, longitude 74.4 West. Dorian is moving toward the west near 8 mph (13 km/h) and a slower westward motion should continue over the next day or two followed by a gradual turn to the northwest. On this track, the core of Dorian should move near or over portions of the northwestern Bahamas on Sunday September 1, 2019.

Maximum sustained winds are near 150 mph (240 km/h) with higher gusts. Dorian is a category 4 hurricane on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale. Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to 30 miles (45 km) from the centre. Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 105 miles (165 km).

The estimated minimum central pressure is 945 mb (27.91 inches).

Caribbean Institute For Meteorology And Hydrology (CIMH) Analysis (as of 2:00 PM)

Disclaimer: The CIMH provides special weather interpretation of the current and forecasted tropical weather affecting the Caribbean Region and is <u>NOT</u> an official forecasting agency.

- WEATHER: Gradual deterioration in weather conditions is expected as Dorian continues to strengthen as a Category 4 hurricane.
- RAINFALL: Dorian is expected to produce total rainfall accumulations this weekend into the middle of next week of 10 to 15 inches (isolated 25 inches) in northwestern Bahamas, and 2 to 4 inches (isolated 6 inches) in central Bahamas. This rainfall may cause lifethreatening flash floods.
- **WINDS:** Hurricane conditions are expected in the hurricane warning area across the northwestern Bahamas by Sunday, with tropical storm winds beginning tonight, August 31, 2019.
- WAVES: Storm surge may reach 10 to 15 feet above normal tide levels in the northwestern Bahamas. Near the coast, the surge will be accompanied by large and destructive waves. Swells will begin to affect the east-facing shores of the Bahamas during the next few days and could cause life-threatening surf and rip current conditions. A marine advisory remains in effect for boat operations, small craft operators and port operations in the warning areas.
- **SUMMARY**: Hurricane Dorian could be a significant rainfall event with high potential for flooding which may cause life-threatening flash floods and landslides.

Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA) Actions

- The Regional Coordination Plan (RCP) remains activated.
- CDEMA, with the financial support of the Government of the United Kingdom and on behalf of the Caribbean Development Partners
 Group on Disaster Management, today deployed two (2) Rapid Needs Assessment Teams to Nassau, Bahamas and a deployment
 lead who will be stationed at the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) in Nassau.
- The teams which are led by CDEMA, comprise 18 persons and will include representatives of the CDEMA Participating States, as well as the Caribbean Media Corporation (CMC), Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA), Global Affairs Canada (GAC), Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), Port Managers Association of the Caribbean (PMAC), Private Sector, United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA), the University of the West Indies (UWI) and the World Food Programme (WFP).
- This deployment is in direct response to a request from the Commonwealth of the Bahamas.
- The Rapid Needs Assessment Teams are expected to support assessments on the family islands most impacted by Dorian in the
 aftermath of the event. The teams will support the Government of the Bahamas in rapidly assessing the damage from the hurricane
 and in prioritizing needs.
- CDEMA and the UN Resident Coordinator Co-Chaired the seventh meeting of the Regional Response Mechanism Partners Caribbean Development Partners Group Disaster Management (CDPG DM), at 1:00 PM today, August 31, 2019. The Caribbean
 Institute for Meteorology and Hydrology (CIMH) provided a brief to this meeting.
- The Regional Response Teams remain on ALERT: CARICOM Disaster Assessment and Coordination (CDAC), CARICOM
 Operational Support Team (COST), the Multi-National Civil Military Coordination Cell (MNCCC) and the CARICOM Disaster Relief
 Unit (CDRU).
- CDEMA continues to maintain communication with the Bahamas to discuss pre-impact scenario plans and to ascertain preliminary needs at this time
- CDEMA CU urges all Participating States and members of the Regional Response Mechanism (RRM) to continue to monitor the progress of this system

National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA)

- > The Emergency Operations Centres (EOCs) on Abaco and Grand Bahama have been activated.
- ➤ The NEOC in Nassau, New Providence was activated on Friday August 30, 2019.
- ➤ Abaco: The Government of Bahamas evacuated persons residing in the Abaco Cayes (northern Bahamas) to Exuma (central Bahamas)
- Grand Bahama: The Government of The Bahamas has evacuated portions of the western and eastern parts of the island which are low-lying to a government owned hotel in the central section of the island on higher ground.
- Preparations are ongoing
