## SITUATION REPORT #1

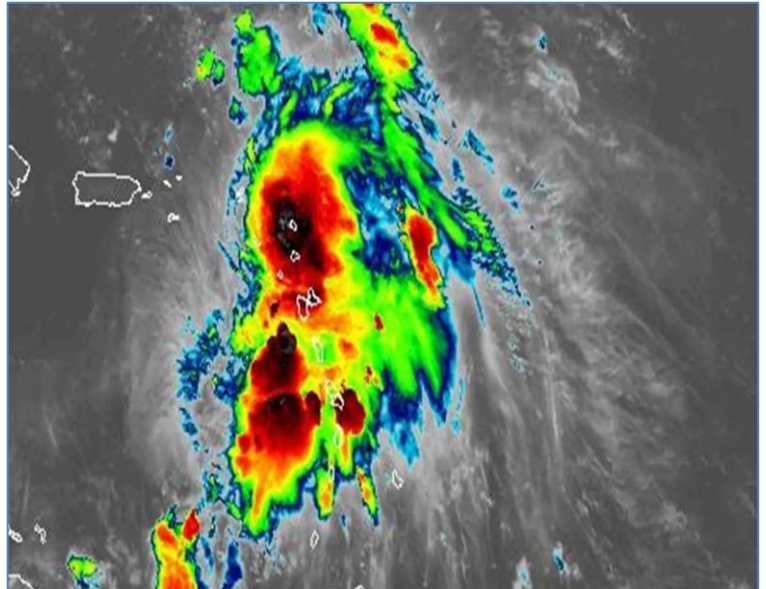

### REGIONAL COORDINATION PLAN (RCP) STOOD-DOWN FOR TS JERRY: MINIMAL DAMAGE REPORTED ACROSS THE STATES

All Tropical Storm Watches and Warnings have been discontinued as follows:

- At 5:00 a.m. EST, the **Tropical Storm Warning** for Anguilla and Barbuda; The **Tropical Storm Watch** for Antigua, Montserrat, and St. Kitts & Nevis.
- At 11:00 a.m. EST, the **Tropical Storm Warning** for Sint Maarten.

While the direct threat from Tropical Storm Jerry has passed trailing rain bands continue to affect the area with potential for localized flooding and landslides in at risk areas.

### Weather Update from the Caribbean Institute of Meteorology and Hydrology (CIMH) at 11:00 AM, 10 October 2025.

Disclaimer: *The CIMH provides special weather interpretation of the current and forecasted tropical weather affecting the Caribbean Region and is NOT an official forecasting agency.*

As at 1:00 p.m. EST today, Tropical Storm Jerry's center was moving away from the northern Leeward Islands but its broad, shared circulation, elongated with deep convection displaced to the south-southeast, continues to generate bands of showers and thunderstorms across the CDEMA Participating States in the Leeward and northern Windward Islands. The forecast indicate additional rainfall is likely today into tomorrow, with up to 4 – 6 inches in Barbuda and 2 – 4 inches across the wider Leeward Islands, sustaining the risk of flash flooding, particularly in urban areas and steep terrain. As Jerry tracks farther into the Atlantic, rainfall is expected to gradually diminish across the Leeward and Windward Islands. Marine hazards remain elevated, with swells producing rough seas and dangerous rip currents, especially along the northern Leeward coasts through tonight. Conditions are generally moderate across the northern Windward Islands.

## Situational Reports From Impacted Participating States



### ANGUILLA

#### *Report from the Department of Disaster Management (DDM)*

- Scattered showers with occasional heavy downpours persist as the tailbands of Tropical Storm Jerry pass over the island.
- Government offices have reopened; banks remained closed today, though some private businesses operated. Schools remain closed as previously scheduled (unrelated to Tropical Storm Jerry).
- Airports and cargo ports remain operational; the passenger port will remain closed until Saturday, October 11, 2025.
- DDM continues to provide updates via its official social media channels.
- No significant damage was reported; no external assistance is required – **RRM Response Level 1.**



### ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA

#### *Report from the Director of the National Office of Disaster Services (NODS)*

- The NEOC was deactivated at 4:30 p.m. EST today, October 10, 2025.
- Island wide damage assessments were conducted supported by NODS.
- There were incidents of isolated power outages in parts of the island however power had since been restored.
- There were reports of flooding and damage to a few buildings in some communities.
- All the reported incidents are being managed locally, no external assistance is required – **RRM Response Level 1.**



### BARBADOS

#### *Update from the Department of Emergency Management (DEM)*

- The Flash Flood Watch was discontinued at 6:00 a.m. EST today, October 10, 2025.
- No significant damage was reported; no external assistance required – **RRM Response Level 1.**



### DOMINICA

#### *Report from the Office of Disaster Management (ODM)*

- At 12:00 noon today, October 10, 2025, the Flash Flood Watch was extended to 6:00 p.m. EST; the Small Craft Warning was downgraded to a Small Craft Advisory, and a High Surf Advisory remains in effect.
- Showers and thunderstorms occurred overnight October 9 – 10, with a maximum of approximately 2–5 inches recorded in the southeast (Delices) and south (Pichelin, Bellevue Chopin, Giraudel).
- Incidents of road blockage and undermining were reported in the south and south-east. Heavy equipment was mobilized to restore access. Isolated power outages occurred overnight, power has been restored.
- High surf affected low-lying coastal communities; no major damage was reported.
- All the reported incidents are being managed locally, no external assistance is required – **RRM Response Level 1.**

## Situational Reports From Impacted Participating States



### MONTSERRAT

#### *Report from the Disaster Management Coordination Agency (DMCA)*

- Government offices and schools remained closed today, Friday, October 10, 2025.
- Heavy showers were recorded overnight.
- No significant damage was reported thus no external assistance is required – **RRM Response Level 1.**



### SAINT LUCIA

#### *Report from the National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO)*

- Heavy rainfall overnight led to localized flooding in at-risk areas. There were additional reports of debris fall, broken branches, and fallen trees.
- The District Disaster Management Committees (DDMCs) quickly cleared the debris to restore access.
- Schools were closed today Friday, October 10, 2025.
- All the reported incidents are being managed locally, no external assistance is required – **RRM Response Level 1.**



### SINT MAARTEN

#### *Report from the Office of Disaster Management (ODM)*

- The Meteorological Department of Sint Maarten advises that additional rainfall is expected this evening.
- No significant damage was reported thus no external assistance required – **RRM Response Level 1.**



### ST. KITTS AND NEVIS

#### *Report from the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA)*

- Heavy showers were reported overnight and into the early morning of Friday, October 10, 2025, with additional showers forecast for this evening.
- Several waterways were temporarily blocked but were promptly cleared.
- Government offices, schools, and businesses remained open.
- No significant damage was reported thus no external assistance required – **RRM Response Level 1.**

- The CARICOM Secretary General and the CDEMA Chairman were briefed by the CDEMA Executive Director on the impact of Tropical Storm Jerry across the CDEMA Participating States.
- The Situation Report #1 – TS Jerry was published.
- All RRM Response Teams have been stood down as at 4:00 p.m. today October 20, 2025.
- The CDEMA Executive Director **deactivated** the Regional Coordination Plan at 4:00 p.m. EST, Friday, October 10, 2025.
