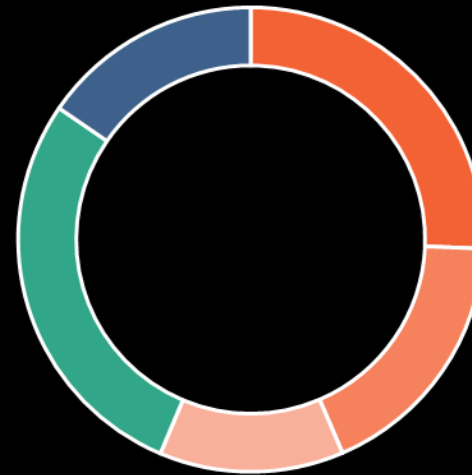
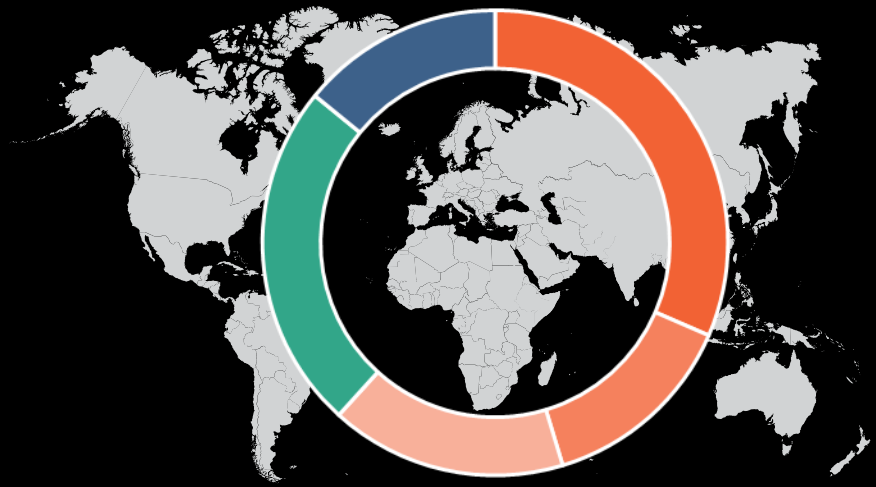

COVID-19 Social Protection Responses in the Eastern Caribbean

Globally, 212 countries/territories have used **social protection** to respond to the impacts of **COVID-19**

...including **all Eastern Caribbean countries and territories.**



- Unemployment benefits to newly unemployed/laid-off workers
- Payroll subsidy or temporary cash transfers to employers/businesses
- Additional transfers to recipients of social assistance programme
- In-kind assistance (e.g. care packages, food vouchers)
- Temporary cash transfers to compensate for income loss
- Temporary expansion of social assistance programmes to new beneficiaries
